beinge sick in body but of perfect memory, thanke be given to God for our ordinaunce and make
his my last will and Testament in manner and forme followinge, first I bequeath my soule into
the hande of Almighty God my maker expectinge to be saved by the merittes of Jesus Christ
my Redeemer And my body I will to be buried in the Church of Warrington aforesaid, And
all my worldly good I dispose as followeth, first I give unto Thomas Combs my eldest sonne
Twentye poundes to be payd to my Executors to his use within one moneth after my decease And
my will and desire is that they should employe it to his use and not to delibeate it unto him
untill he come to the age of xxij years, I give unto William Combs my sonne Twentye poundes
to be payd to my Executors to his use within two years after my decease And my will and
desire is that they should employe it to his use but not delibeate it unto him untill he come
to the age of xxij years, I give unto Jane Combs my daughter Twentye poundes to be
payd to my Executors within two years after my decease to her use And my will and desire
is that they should employe it to her use but not delibeate it unto her untill she come to
the age of xxij years, And if it shall happen that any of my said children die before he or
she becometh of age I give to his or her portion with the increase of it Even my will is that
his or her portion with the increase shall remaine to his or her executor or executors equally to
be divided, I give to the poore of Warrington y^e I give to the poore of Cheshire y^e, All
the rest of my good chattell and chattells I give to Elizabeth my wyfe myne I make co
and executrix of his my last will and Testament, my will is that Elizabeth my wyfe shall have
the house full by her diction of my Executors, my Executors I make my brother William
Gardner my brother Robert Robins and William Hall to receive and execute of my
Executor and of her portions, In witness whereof to his my last will and Testament I have
setto my hande the day and date written, Richard Combs his mark. In the presence of us
William Hall Justice of the peace.
